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## Academic Appointments

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2015 - Present                      University of Winchester

I am the Module Leader for Property Law and Equity and Trusts. This involves designing the course, delivering all the lectures, setting and marking formative and summative assessments. I also write and deliver tutorials in all three subjects. I completely redesigned the Property Law module aiming to make the subject more relevant to the students. My teaching has been well received by students, with comments including “the feedback definitely showed me how to improve”, and “I like your style of teaching and you make it fun”. I also research UK constitutional law, and details of my publications and conference presentations can be found on the next page.

2013 - 2015                         King’s College London

At King’s College London I taught tutorials in Public Law and Equity and Trusts. My role included marking both formative and summative assessments. The tutorial groups included students from all over the world, and the size varied from 15 to 30.

2013                                     Manchester Metropolitan University

I delivered workshops for EU Law on the postgraduate GDL course. The course focused on the legal structure of the institutions and the internal market. The distinctive feature of this teaching is the group based nature of the workshops, with the focus being on ‘active’ rather than ‘passive’ learning, which is more akin to the teaching on the Legal Practice Course than traditional university teaching. Although I was asked to continue this position into the next semester, I chose to decline their offer in order to concentrate on my PhD.

2012                                     China/EU School of Law, China University of Political  
Science and Law

I was part of a delegation that travelled to Beijing to teach English Legal Skills to postgraduate students at the China/EUSchool of Law. The teaching was seminar-based and involved teaching Chinese students fundamental legal skills including *stare decisis*, statutory interpretation and the European legal method. I also assisted in designing the course and contributed to the accompanying lecture series.

2011 - 2015                         University of Manchester

My main role was teaching Constitutional Law, Administrative Law and Constitutional Reform. This involved taking seminars of 10-12 students. An internal peer review at Manchester recently rated my teaching as 25/25, with a comment from the reviewer stating that the ‘Law School is fortunate to have Craig doing this for us’. Feedback from students has been equally positive with comments including ‘amazingly detailed feedback’ and ‘very intellectual and approachable’.
